## 1. About your Institution (800-1000 Words)

**MGM New Bombay College of Nursing**, a constituent unit of MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai (MGMIHS) laid its foundation on 1<sup>st</sup> August 2008 for B.Sc. Nursing Programme. In the last eighteen years the college of nursing has grown profoundly to impart education for Under Graduate to Post Graduate, and Doctoral programs in Nursing. A total of 594 B.Sc. Nursing, 119 Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing, 40 M.Sc., 45 NPCC and 38 PhD Nursing students have been graduated from the college.

- h) Perform any other administrative duties as assigned by the authorities.
- i) Participate in Hospital accreditation related responsibilities.
- j) Conduct periodic meetings to resolve the operational difficulties.
- k) Aim for NABH Nursing excellence accreditation in the hospital and international accreditation of Nursing education of the college.
- l) Enhance competency-based education among students.

***The Context :*** Nursing is practice discipline which focuses on application of knowledge and skills on patient care with the right attitude. The Nursing curriculum prescribed by the Indian Nursing Council is a competency-based curriculum which involves measuring performance of students at different levels. The students are evaluated in the classrooms for cognitive and affective domains. The psychomotor and affective domain is evaluated in the clinical settings where skills and knowledge are applied in patient care. Rich clinical experience with healthy teaching - learning environment is the best method for bringing meaningful learning outcome of students.

The College of Nursing believes that integration of Nursing Education and Service which provides an excellent teaching - learning environment and facilitates both quality student learning and patient care. The reciprocal services also help the hospital nursing services to instill academic and research temperament among the nurses working in the hospital.

***The Practice:*** The college has taken up following steps in the practice of dual responsibilities at Nursing education and Nursing service.

- The concept of Dual Responsibilities in Nursing Education and Nursing service at MGM started in the year 2016. The head of Nursing College Dr. Prabha K. Dasila is Leading the hospital as Director of Nursing and Vice Principal Dr. R. Ponchitra till April 2024 and Mrs. Susan Jacob w.e.f. April 2024 as Deputy Director of Nursing. Primary and specific roles and responsibilities of the faculties for performing dual responsibilities in the hospital and college has been refined.
- The Senior teaching faculty are designated to perform various important Nursing Administrative responsibilities in the hospital. Two faculty members at the level of Professor/Associate Professor Nursing are designated as Nursing Superintendents. Mrs. Maria Preethi Mathew, Professor for Infection Control and Nursing Manpower Management, Dr. Padmaja Dhawale, Associate Professor for Patient Care and Quality Control. Dr. Vandana Kumbhar, Associate Professor is designated as Chief Nurse educator for in-service Nursing Education in the hospital.



- Two Associate Professors Dr. Ferganzia Jubilson & Mrs. Sarika Nair are given the responsibility of Intensive care units. They are also given the responsibility AHA stroke accreditation certification and AHA chest pain accreditation certification in collaboration with MGM Skill lab, MGM Hospital Kamothe. Dr. Sindhu Thomas Associate Professors is assigned to look after the management of Paediatric units.
- All other teaching faculty members are assigned to monitor patient care in various units while supervising the students in the hospital.
- The Post Graduate Nursing Professionals working in the hospital are taking part in teaching the students as per the areas of their specialization.
- Frequent meetings are conducted with the staff of both hospital and nursing college to discuss day to day issues of the hospital for better coordination and student learning.
- In-service classes are conducted on regular basis as per the schedule.
- Counselling of nursing personnel in the hospital is conducted on regular basis for smooth staff – student relationships.
- Hospital nurses are encouraged to attend workshops, conferences organized in the campus or outside MGM Campus and present their work to provide the opportunity to grow.
- Recruitment of nursing staffs for various positions are conducted regularly.
- Induction program for newly recruited nursing staffs are conducted systematically along with competency tests to place right nurse at right job.
- Credentialing & privileging of Nursing Professionals periodically.
- Grievance redressal as soon as possible as and when required.

### ***Evidence of Success***

1. From 1<sup>st</sup> August, 2024 the responsibilities of teaching faculty are redefined and expanded for efficient management of Nursing Services in the hospital. The designated teaching faculty actively participate with the hospital team for continuation of NABH accreditation related activities.
2. New Nursing Manpower policy have been prepared which is approved by Hon'ble Trustee & Medical Director on 05/09/2023. The new policy is implemented with effect from June 2024.
3. The involvement of teaching faculty of nursing college helped the staff nurses in motivating to pursue for higher studies. Total - 30 Nurses have successfully completed their higher studies from the year 2022 out of which 07 have pursued Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing, 06 M.Sc. Nursing and 03 M.Sc (Nurse Practitioner in Critical Care) Post Graduate Program. 10 students have sought admission for Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing, M.Sc. Nursing and M.Sc. (Nurse Practitioner in Critical Care) for the academic year 2024-2025.
4. Our Alumni have extended their helping hand by joining the hospital as team leaders and Nurse Practitioners for efficiently managing the intensive care units of MGM Hospital Kamothe. The Alumni of M.Sc. Nursing Ms. Aarti Patil is managing SICU, Ms. Komal Kathare SICU and Ms. Minakshi Musale is managing EMSICU.
5. Our Alumni of M.Sc. Nurse Practitioner in Critical Care Mr. Rishabh Jain EMSICU, Ms. Suvartha Nathaniel CVTSICU, Ms. Shaila Ghanekar MICU are leading in managing the patient care in Critical Care units of MGM Hospital Kamothe.
6. Total 20 M.Sc. (NPCC) and 15 B.Sc. Nursing graduates have joined their Alma matter to support the institution and serve the hospital is the greatest evidence of the success of dual responsibilities.



7. The audit of nursing services i.e. Patient Care, Infection Control and Quality Control are conducted on regular basis by the assigned faculty and their team.
8. The HR policies are implemented well. Systems are created for timely response to the Professional requirements of Nurses example issuance of appointment letters, reference letters, overseas applications, recruitments and promotions.
9. Timely redressal of grievances and support to the problems of nurses any time during the day by the teaching faculty.
10. The Post Graduate Nurses from hospital are included in the Teaching and Learning process of nursing students.
11. The hospital in-service education programme is monitored by the concerned college faculty (Dr. Vandana Kumbhar) daily.
12. Mrs. Preethi Maria Mathew, Professor coordinated well for efficient placement of students from MGM NBCON Kamothe, MGM CON & MGM FNINE Vashi in various shifts at different departments of MGM Medical College Hospital Kamothe & Kalamboli.
13. The hospital welcomes the teaching faculty from nursing college. They are also part of various committees in the hospital.
14. The strength of Nursing manpower in the hospital has been improved over the previous year. Various new departments in the hospital have started which are managed well.
15. The hospital is certified as Comprehensive Stroke Centre and Chest Pain Centers by AHA.
16. Five Doctorate of Nurse Practitioner (DNP) scholars are admitted to the course. The DNP scholars are working in different Critical Care Units and working on their Evidence Based Projects.

***Problems Encountered and Resources Required***

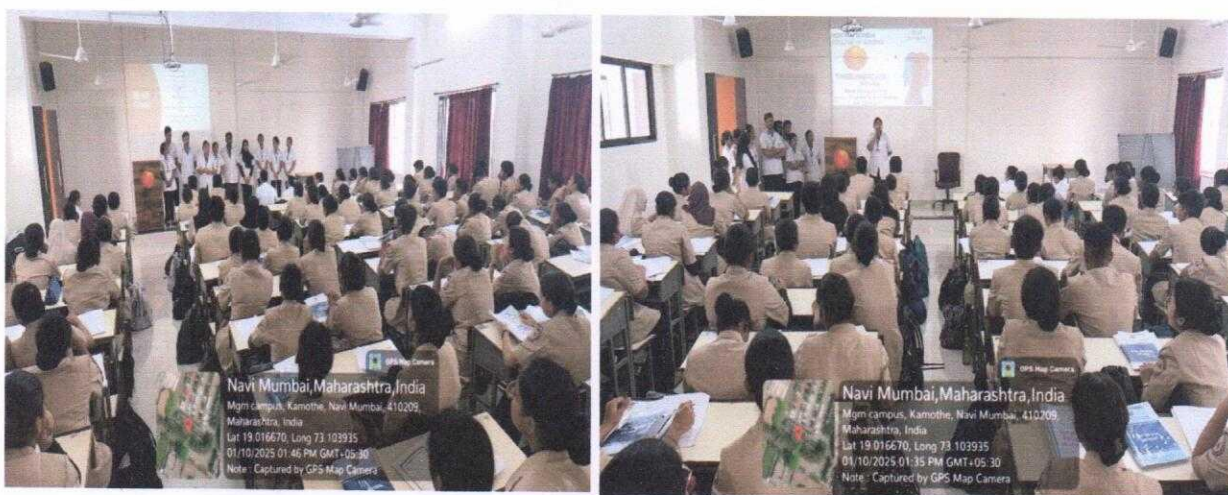
d) **Women’s safety and helpline initiatives**

The skits also showcased the functions and responsibilities of the government-run Gender Sensitization Committee. The session was highly engaging and was well-received by the students. Participants - 100



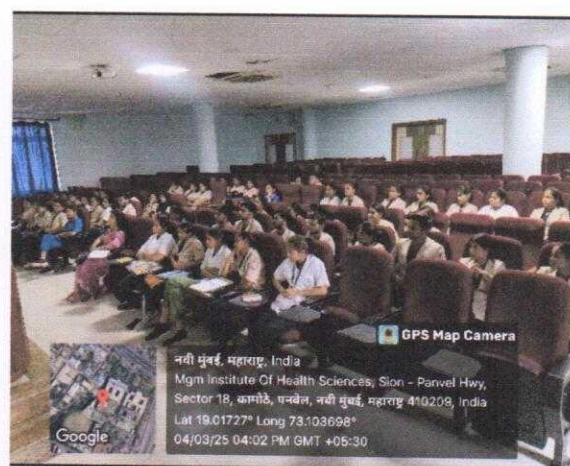

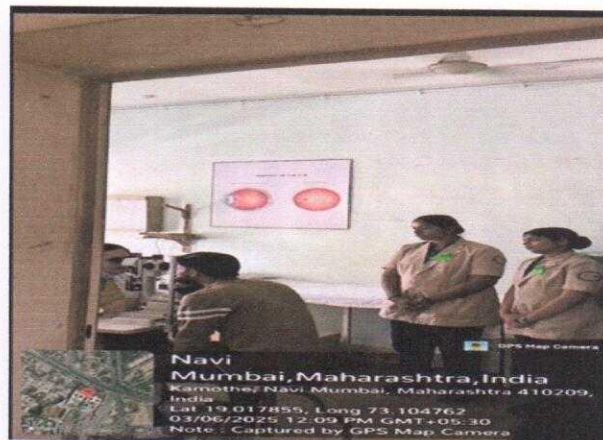

## **F. Green and Sustainable Initiatives / Activities:**

### **Recycling paper -**

#### **1. Title of the Practice: Recycling of Used Papers.**

#### **2. Objectives of the Practice**

1. To create awareness among students on protecting the environment from pollution, reducing trash on landfill and cut cost on waste disposal through recycling.
2. To encourage students for collection of paper waste for recycling.
3. To motivate faculty and students for conducting awareness to the community on recycling.
4. To carryout competitions on best out of waste during the annual extracurricular activities.
5. To participate in tree plantation drive with in campus and villages adopted under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan.
6. To instill students, the value of environmental consciousness.

#### **3. The Context**

An educational institution utilizes papers on day to day basis for various purposes. Similarly, waste papers are also generated daily. The wastes papers from students come from the work of their studies while at the office from daily administrative jobs. At the end of each academic year bulks of used papers are found at the corners of the hostel, common rooms and the offices which is a hazard to health as well as fire safety. It also interferes with the ambiance of the institute.

Recycling paper helps to reduce greenhouse gas emissions that can contribute to climate change. Paper recycling also saves the natural wood raw stock, decreases the operation and capital costs to paper units. The paper fibre contains carbon (originally absorbed by the tree from which it was produced), recycling keeps the carbon locked up for longer and out of the atmosphere. It prevents air and water pollution which is harmful to the environment.

Recycling saves waste paper from occupying landfills and producing methane as it breaks down. Through recycling process, the waste paper is turned into new paper or products.

#### **4. The Practice**

To make it a regular practice the Paper collection bins are placed in every class room and office.

1. All students, faculty and administrative staff are sensitized and encouraged to participate in collecting the waste papers in the bins provided in the designated areas.
2. Important and confidential documents are being segregated and only true waste goes in the bins for recycling.
3. The students, faculty and administrative staff collect the waste papers in the bins placed at the designated areas.
4. Once the bins are full, they are sealed and collected at one place.
5. An email is sent to the respective recycling vendor for picking up the filled boxes.
6. The vendor comes to college. Weighs the content in the boxes.
7. Loads in their vehicle and takes it for recycling.
8. Certificate of recycling is issued to the college by the respective agency.



## 5. Evidence of Success

1. The students, faculty and administrative staff collect the waste papers in the bins provided at the set locations in their day to day practice and it is given for recycling every year.
2. Total 680 kilograms of waste papers have been recycled in the year 2024-2025. Certificate of recycling received.
3. Students and faculty also participated actively in tree plantation with in MGM campus.

## 6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

1. The vendor has to wait till 400 Kilogram of paper waste is cumulated.
2. Keeping the bulk paper collected becomes a difficult task for storing.
3. Scrutiny and segregation of important papers and shredding them without having a proper machine.



### a) Eco-friendly workshops

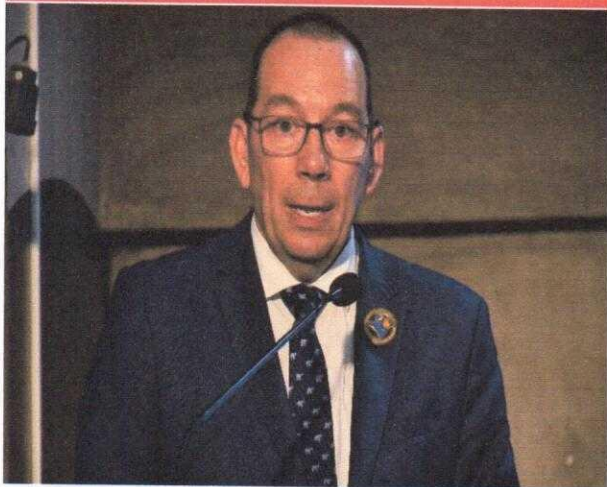

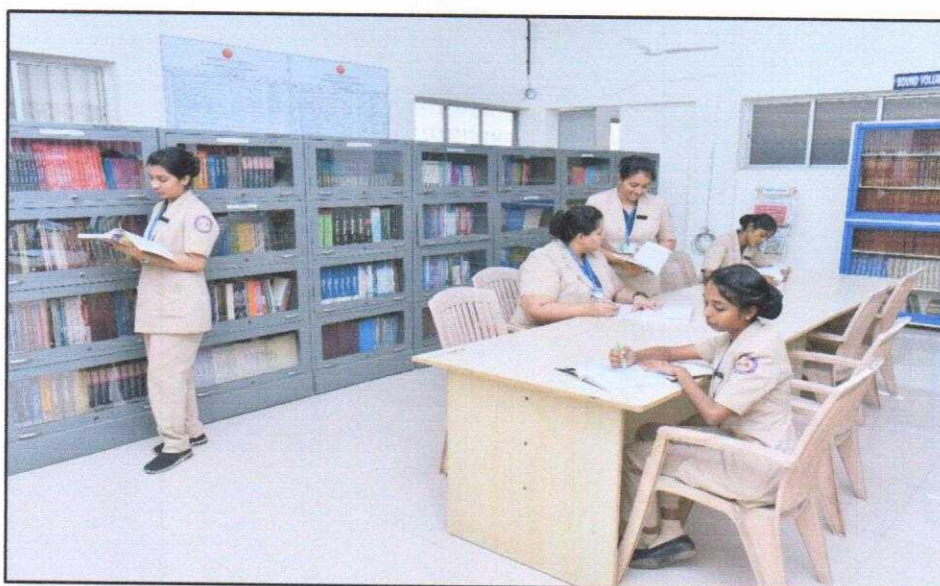

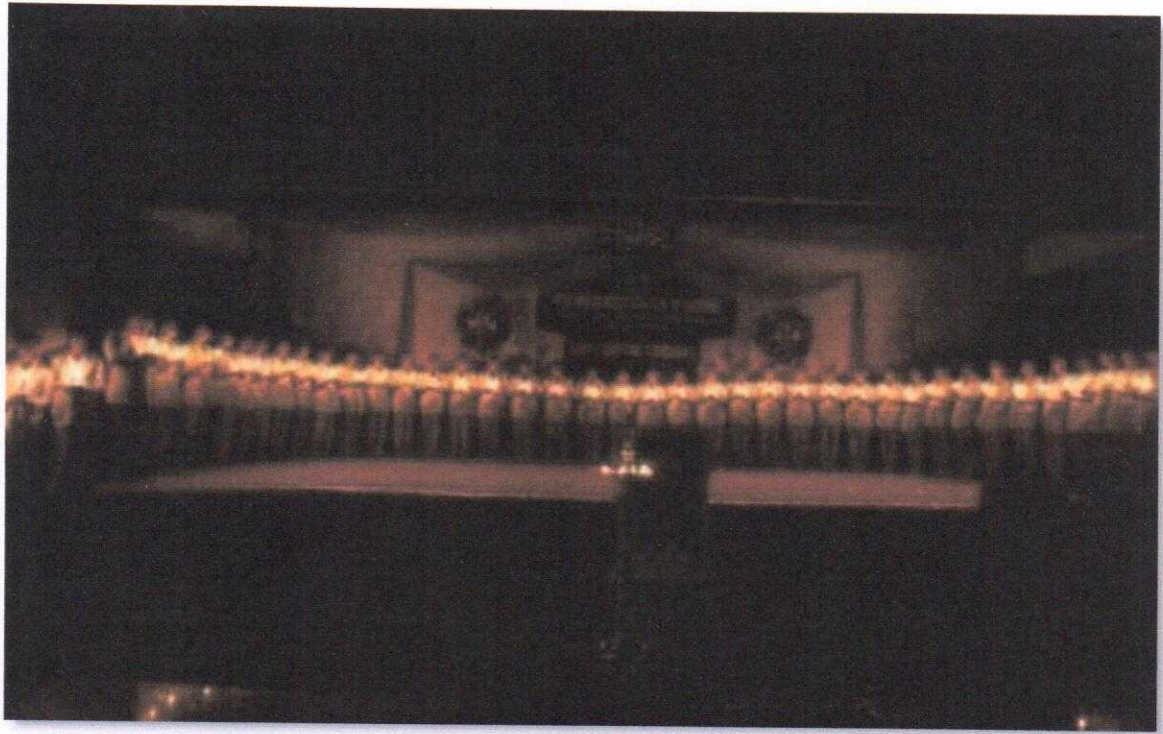
